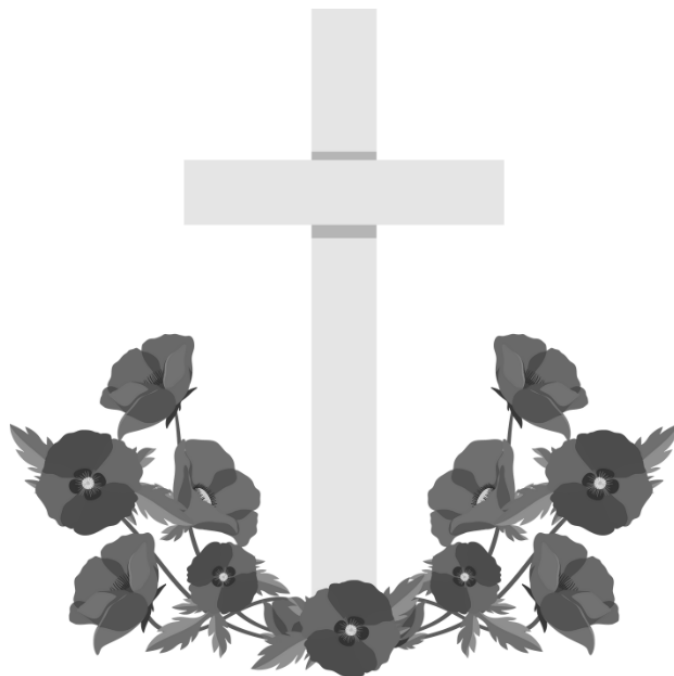


REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY
